SAG Driver – Job Description

We'll have 4 SAG drivers on this event, including and supervised by the SAG Director.

This position requires:

- Good people skills
- Ability to work well with crew members and riders of all ages and backgrounds
- Communicating well
- Flexible thinking
- Diplomacy and tactfulness with crew, riders and vendors
- Enjoying being with people
- Making rational on-the-spot decisions
- A current valid driver's license and meeting age requirements for rental vehicles
- A relatively clean driving record
- Current First Aid/CPR certification (we'll pay for training if needed)
- Must have smartphone with data, text, and call service. (BRNW can assist if needed)
- Must be familiar with the Ride with GPS app or willing to learn the app
- Ability to function in the early morning
- The ability to do physical labor, including lifting and moving equipment
- The ability to lift bikes of up to 65 pounds onto a van rooftop rack and secure them properly
- The willingness to help, however needed, and to drive safely all day

SAG Driver duties before and after the rides include, but are not limited to:

- Connect with the SAG Director prior to the ride starts, to learn the processes and procedures of being a SAG driver
- Read and comprehend the "SAG Driver Guide" prior to ride start
- Be in town on the days before and after a ride, as needed for preparation and equipment return
- Assist the SAG Director in picking up SAG vehicles and installing racks
- Assist the SAG Director with removing all the racks and loading the equipment on the trucks
- Assist the SAG Director with returning SAG vehicles

SAG Driver duties during the event include, but are not limited to:

- Keep moving up and down the route, staying in order – **lights on** – supplying any rider support needed
- Transport riders when they need rides
- Make sure your vehicle is supplied with water, tools, snacks, radios, racks, signs, first aid kits, flag, chalk and any other equipment and supplies needed
- Take riders to emergency care or other facility if required or as advised by EMTs – notify the Event Director and SAG Director immediately
- Keep in communication with each other, especially if there is an emergency that will be taking one of the SAGs off the course
- You may on rare occasions be asked to take riders to off-site destinations for personal emergencies
- Help riders with minor repairs such as changing flat tires and putting chains back on
- Remove hazards in the road such as falling rocks; mark hazards such as potholes, dangerous cattle guards and loose gravel if the Route team has not already done it
- Stay in communication with the Rest Stops teams so they know how many riders are left and when the last rider is approaching their stop; they can also pass info to you
- **Always keep your gas tank at least half-full**

Day 0 (Sunday):

If available, you may be asked to assist in picking up vans and loading equipment, bikes and supplies.

Day 6 (Saturday)

At the end of the ride, you may be asked to assist in removing equipment, dropping off rental vehicles and loading the transport trucks.

Amenities

- Crew members will receive exclusive event gear
- We'll provide lunch in Cleveland Commons on each day you work
- You'll have access to other amenities available to the riders (snacks, beverages, etc.)
- You can ride in either BRNW 2026 week-long tour for 50% off

For this to work, it's critical that you be a TEAM PLAYER, and be pleasant at all times. The reason we all do these events – crew and riders – is to have fun!
